7 The Green parties of the EFGP

8  
9 1. Firmly condemn the reoccupation by the Israeli army and security forces of the areas under the full  
10 administration of the Palestinian National Authority and call on the Israeli government to immediately  
11 withdraw its troops, put an end to the long standing blockade of the Occupied territories and to stop  
12 mass detention of people, occupation and demolition of Palestinian buildings and houses and all the  
13 actions against medical and humanitarian personnel and vehicles which are making even more  
14 dramatic the toll of innocent lives paid by the Palestinian community.

16 2. Firmly condemn all terrorist acts against Israeli civilians and call on Chairman Arafat and the  
17 Palestinian authorities to do their utmost to end immediately the acts of violence, to bring the  
18 perpetrators to justice, and to stop any direct or indirect support of the terror.

19  
20 3. Urge Israeli Prime Minister to stop the confinement of Arafat putting an end to his humiliating  
21 isolation and allowing him to take back his full functions as democratically elected president of the  
22 Palestinian National Authority.

23  
24 4. Give their full support to the proposals of the green German minister Joschka Fischer for a peace  
25 plan for the Middle East.

27 5. State that the goals of the political process that will lead to a peaceful solution of this conflict should  
28 include:

- 29 • the existence of the state of Israel within secure and internationally recognised borders, on the
- 30 basis of all relevant UN Security Council resolutions
- 31 • the existence of an independent and viable Palestinian state beside Israel
- 32 • mutual recognition of both states
- 33 • recognition of Israel by the Arab world according to the Beirut Arab summit proposals
- 34 • joint security of both states under international guarantees
- 35 • the renunciation of occupation and terror.

37 6. Are in favour of a UN Protection Force in the Middle East so as to keep a ceasefire, defuse tension  
38 and protect the civilian population. The EU should actively give its support to such a UN Protection  
39 Force. This force can be an element of the security guarantees that should be offered by the  
40 internationale community as part of the peace process.

41  
42 7. Support the request of the European Parliament (April 10, 2002) to suspend the association  
43 agreements between EU and Israel.

44  
45 8. Are in favour of an embargo on the export of EU weapons and dual use goods to Israel and  
46 Palestine.

47  
48 9. Are in favour of a mission of EU observers so as to monitor the situation on the ground and urges  
49 both parties to accept such initiative.

50  
51 10. Express their solidarity to the Jewish communities who have been victims of anti-semitic attacks  
52 and call on all authorities involved to react promptly against such acts.

53  
54 11. Express their full solidarity to the Israeli Army reservists refusing to serve in the occupied  
55 territories; believes that conscientious objection as well as other ongoing grassroot and international  
56 peace initiatives are a concrete way of stopping violence and that their civil disobedience contributes  
57 to pave the way for peace.

59 12. Express their solidarity with the peace camp on both sides and their readiness to actively support  
60 these people.

62 13. Call on Israel to guarantee media and humanitarian organizations free access to the occupied  
63 territories and to allow EU diplomatic and consular authorities to contact EU citizens in the area.
