2 PROPOSAL OF Los Verdes

3 4 **RESOLUTION ABOUT WESTERN SAHARA**

6 The participants in the EFGP Congress, aware of the serious situation suffered by the saharawi
7 people due to the blockade of 1991 UN peace plan, and considering the negative consequences
8 that a possible renew of the hostilities will have in the Magreb area, we think it's necessary that:
9

10 1.- The UN, the Security Council and his Secretary-General must strictly apply the peace plan as
11 agreed by the parties, that includes the implementation of a free, democratic and transparent
12 self-determination Referendum which will definitely settle the decolonisation process of Western
13 Sahara.

15 2.- The EU, the countries members and the governments that represent them, should be involved
16 in a active way in the defence of the immediate application of the peace plan and the rights of the
17 saharawi people as they are recognized by the international legality, avoiding any other initiative
18 that might pretend to supplant them.

20 3.- The European Greens will move in all the institutions in which they are present,
21 governments, parliaments, and municipal councils, politic initiatives that will support the
22 self-determination Referendum of the saharawi people.

24 4.- Considering the reiterated denunciation made by human rights associations, jurists, NGO's
25about the systematic violation of the human rights, repression, arbitrary arrests, tortures,
26 kidnappings and missing, committed to the saharawi population in the occupied territories of
27 Western Sahara by the kingdom of Marocco, the European Greens will send an official
28 delegation to the Western Sahara in order to break the actual isolated situation in which the
29 saharawi people is.

31 5.- Considering the alarming shortage in basic food commodities suffered by the population of
32 the saharawi refugee camps in Tindouf (Algeria), we appeal to the international organizations
33 (WPF, UNCHR, ECHO) to perform their duties of attendance to more than 160.000 saharawi
34 refugees.
